Chroma keying: Post-production technique that allows a specific color (like the green cloth in the image above) to be removed so another image can replace it.

Rules for Recording

Rule #1: Choose clothing carefully...



...or you will blend in.

Rule #2: Use proper lighting...




...or you will get a wrinkled effect.



Rule #3: Measure your cloth

... or you will have gaps.

Step by Step Green Screen Videos:

- 1. Get equipment listed above
- 2. Download video editing software of your choice
 - a. Options for Mac/iOS and Windows/Android listed above
- 3. Hang your green cloth behind the piano
 - a. Make sure it is evenly lit
- 4. Choose background images/videos from the internet resources listed above
 - a. Make sure they are saved on your device
- 5. Open the video editing app you downloaded
 - a. Remember to build from bottom to top
 - i. Background is placed on the bottom timeline
 - ii. Foreground is placed above it
- 6. Record, save, and share!
