



Engaging Works for Piano Six Hands

Background:

Keyboard trios (music for six hands at one piano) have been a unique part of piano ensemble repertoire since the development of the piano. Works for three players at separate keyboards can be found in the 17th and 18th centuries, such as the harpsichord concerti by J. S. Bach (1685-1750) and the "Lodron" Concerto by W. A. Mozart (1756-1791). It was in the early 19th century—with the continued development of larger pianos—that compositions for six hands at one keyboard began to appear in the form of both original compositions and arrangements/transcriptions of popular works.

As with piano duets, teachers often composed six-hand pieces for their pupils. Some of the earliest composers of six-hand music include those included on tonight's program: Wilhelm Friedrich Ernst Bach (1759-1845), Carolus Antonius Fodor (1768-1846) and Cornelius Gurlitt (1820-1901).

In the 19th century, *salon* works for six hands gained in popularity, and by the early 20th century, the educational value of this ensemble became widely recognized by teachers, pedagogical composers and publishers alike. Many compositions from this period carry subtitles such as "The Three Sisters" or "The Three Amateurs," reflecting ensemble playing in the home with friends and family. A great example of this is the set of two pieces by Rachmaninoff, written for his cousins, the Skalon sisters.

In additional to a recent upswing in pedagogical works for the genre, Contemporary composers such as Noël Lee, George Crumb, Peter Schickele and Alexander Peskanov have written effective works for the genre. We hope you enjoy today's presentation and we look forward to bringing you more works for piano six hands!

Pedagogical considerations:

- -Seating: chairs, benches or a combination thereof.
- -Pedalling: Who will do it? Depends on the piece, age/height of players.
- -Page turning: Assign this ahead of time based on the activity of the part.
- -Shared territory: When players share a key or group of keys, plan ahead geographically, where the hands will go, i.e., inside vs. outside of the key. Hand and finger position are crucial.
- -Dynamic considerations for variety of sound and clarity.
- -Team Decisions: Articulation, speed of attack, conduct, breathe, release of notes.
- -Are the parts even divided in terms of interest or division of the melodic line?
