


PRIVATE MUSIC TEACHER SURVEY

57.3% of instructors agree that racism is a problem in music education. 16% of teachers are actively promoting BIPOC composers but 70.2% feel they do not have access to resources that help them address the equity gap.

SYLLABUS STUDY

Pieces by men are increasing at a steadier and higher rate than pieces by women. Only two women of colour are present in Canadian piano curriculum. Women are gradually phased out as the conservatory levels get higher. White women make up 13.1% of 20th and 21st century repertoire over the last 50 years. Women of colour make up 0.6%.


