Bohuslav Martinů (1890-1959)

- Born in Polička, a small town in Bohemia close to the Moravian border
- Studied at Prague Conservatory: violin, organ, composition
- Worked at Czech Philharmonic Orchestra
 - Exposed to various styles of his contemporaries
 - o Inspired by Debussy, Roussel, Stravinsky, and Les Six
- Residency in France
 - o Broadened compositional styles and combined with Czech elements
 - Impressionist Period (1907-1923): influenced by Debussy. Composed works in the style of impressionism.
 - Neoclassical Period: influenced by Stravinsky. Matured compositional style combined with jazz and popular dance
- Piano works
 - Composed over 180 works for piano solos
 - Wide in difficulty range
 - o Intermediate pieces include his significant compositional style in a succinct manner
