PRINCIPLES

For each principle, ask yourself: "Based on this truth about learning, HOW can I best teach?"

#1: We Learn RHYTHM and TONAL audiation separately.

<u>Rhythm Components</u>: (1) Macrobeats, (2) Microbeats, and (3) Rhythm Patterns.

<u>Meter</u>: Duple, Triple, or some kind of combination.

Rhythm Syllables: Gordon Syllables

Tonal Components: (1) Tonality and (2) Tonal Patterns.

Tonal Syllables: Moveable DO with a LA-based Minor

#2: We Learn Through Contrasts.

#3: We Learn Music Like We Learn Language.

- 1. Listening
- 2. Speaking (Singing songs and chanting rhythms)
- 3. Thinking (Audiation/Improvisation)
- 4. Reading
- 5. Writing

#4: We Learn CONTENT within CONTEXT.

#5: We Learn Rhythm Through Movement.



CONCLUSION

- 1. Address RHYTHM and TONAL separately.
- 2. Provide contrasts.
- 3. Approach music like a language.
- 4. Be sure to establish context along with presenting content.
- 5. Get your students moving!
