
Stage 1

"Method Book Period"


it is important to keep beginner students' interests in with a main method book and supplements, encouraging active playing rather than cramming education.

Method Book 1: Tales of a Musical Journey 1,2


- Young beginner (Ages 4 and above)

- Learn music theory using images from musical kingdom



- Focus on hand shapes and wrist position for good sound



- Play pieces with accompanying (free audio tracks)

Method book 2 : Piano adventures sere level 1 -3


- Young beginner (Ages 6 to 11)



- Teach note name and musical staff with easy words
- Study ear training and music theory




- Be exposed to various piano literature and famous composers
- Develop finger independence with right hand position

- Young beginner (Ages 6 to 11)
- Study musical forms
- Use this book for solo performance on stage



Stage 2

"Standard repertoire for young pianists"

Improving techniques with musical expression is important. Teachers should focus on finger techniques for difficult passages with good sounds based on musical expression.


Main Repertoire: Studies in Technique


Easy level to moderately difficult level

- Hand coordination, Diatonic & Chromatic scalar, Trill, Arpeggio, etc.




2. Thirty New Studies in Technique, op. 849

- Training for the virtuoso music of the romantic period.





- Discovery of students' own musical tastes



- Learn how to express music in the melodic and short pieces





- Study small sonata form in Classical period : Clementi Sonatinas




