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# **Biographical Sketch**

- Ms. Naoko Ikeda lives in Sapporo, Hokkaido in northern Japan.
- She holds degree in piano performance from Yamaguchi College of Arts in Japan
- Growing up in a music loving family, Ikeda was always surrounded by a wide variety of music in the house

• Ikeda started to take voice lessons when she was 4 years old, then started piano at the age of 6.

• Her childhood experience had a great influence on her career as a composer.

### **Compositional Inspirations:**

• Key influence: American composer William Gillock (1917-1993) "Gillock's works present beautiful resonances and create rich scenes" →Ikeda's goal for her own compositions

• A Wide Varieties of Musical Genres: Classical music, jazz, movie music, popular songs, and Japanese traditional music.

- Artworks, stories, movies, picture books, and photos.
  →"I value the scene felt by the melody, and the melody heard from the scene."
- "Melody comes first": a style that came from her childhood voice lessons.
  - Write pieces based on the idea that she can sing the melody freely
  - Use natural chord progressions with reference to jazz and popular theory
  - Consider the specific areas where she wants to make slight harmonic changes for more color.

# **Characteristics**:

- speaking-like, very singable
- flowing right-hand melody vs. steady left-hand accompaniment

# Notes from the composer:

- This piece was influenced by American pop ballad from the 1980s
- The performer can choose a word before "you" in the title based on their interpretations

# Possible challenges:

- finger pedaling on both hands
- legato pedal
- legato playing
- syncopation
- voicing in chords

### **Characteristics:**

- effective and thought-provoking
- full of colorful harmonies

### Notes from the composer:

A night of shooting stars Seen from different sides of distant shores In time insight dawns; No promises are broken. A night of shooting stars Enveloping the colossal universe And love sings blissful dreams From which it never wakes.

### **Possible challenges:**

- extensive range
- fingering can be tricky
- finger pedaling on both hands
- legato pedal & legato playing
- frequent ritardando $\rightarrow$  musically demanding
- tricky rhythmic patterns (syncopation, triplets, polyrhythm)

### **Characteristics:**

- sweet and peaceful
- steady left-hand pattern, reminiscent of raindrop

### Notes from the composer:

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- This piece combines Japanese traditional scales with
- modern harmonies

• It portrays the rainy season, as well as the beautiful & peaceful hydrangeas after the rain.

### **Possible challenges:**

- frequent subtle tempo change
- legato pedal
- nuances in the recurring theme
- tricky rhythm
