Collegiate Membership

Collegiate members enjoy the same privileges as active members, but are ineligible to vote, hold office or enter students in MTNA competitions. The collegiate membership year is October 1 to September 30.

Membership Categories

Active Membership is open to all individuals residing in the United States or its territories who are professionally engaged in the music field and also are members of an affiliated state association. Active membership entitles you to participate in all Association activities and programs, receive official Association publications, vote and hold office. The active membership year is July 1 to June 30.

Collegiate Membership is open to all college students currently involved in music study who also are members of an affiliated state association. Collegiate members enjoy the same privileges as active members, but are ineligible to vote, hold office or enter students in MTNA competitions. The collegiate membership year is October 1 to September 30.

International Membership is open to individuals residing in other countries outside the United States and its territories. International members enjoy the same privileges as active members, including receiving official Association publications, but are ineligible to vote, hold office or enter students in MTNA competitions. International members cannot hold concurrent membership in an affiliated state association. The international membership year is July 1 to June 30.

Six-Month Membership is available to individuals meeting active membership criteria, who have never been MTNA members. The sixmonth membership runs from January 1 through June 30. Many states also offer six-month memberships. Contact the national office for information.
